#### **Reconciliation-Focused initiatives**

#### **Education and Learning**

- Producing a monthly newsletter highlighting Indigenous learning opportunities and resources.
- Establishing and maintaining a dedicated Indigenous collection within the church library.
- Donating more than 100 books and educational resources to support ongoing learning.
- Organizing four book studies focused on forgiveness, healing, and reconciliation.
- Screening Indigenous documentaries and films to deepen understanding and awareness.
- Auditing Indigenous studies and reconciliation courses offered through Canadian universities.

#### **Cultural Awareness and Appreciation**

- Donating Indigenous artwork for display in Heritage Hall.
- Providing Indigenous-themed cards, calendars, stamps, and other educational materials.
- Photographing Indigenous events to help document and celebrate community activities.

#### **Community Engagement and Advocacy**

- Participating in and helping organize the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation events in Brockville.
- Supporting and helping offer the True North Aid Reconciliation Walk in Brockville.
- Inviting guest speakers to share their knowledge, experiences, and perspectives on reconciliation.
- Meeting with elected officials to advocate for Indigenous rights and justice.
- Supporting petitions and initiatives that promote Indigenous human rights.

Through education, relationship-building, and community action, our Indigenous Reconciliation Education Program seeks to respond to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action and to live out our Christian commitment to justice, respect, and reconciliation.
